A Proof of the Philadelphia Experiment? German "moles" in the project ?

I found a reference to **the Philadelphia Experiment** in an Italian book (**La Barriera Magnetica - the Magnetic Barrier** by G.B. Ferlini, Ed. Mediterranee, 1986). The book is mainly related to the nature of cosmic rays and magnetic phenomena. Unfortunately, I don't own the book now. In the book, the author (an engineer) talks about a Scientific Congress done in Germany in WWII. A speaker talked about "American experiments in which by means of electric and magnetic fields, an 'artificial fog' was created. This fog was used to hide a ship."

A leak in the Philadelphia Experiment? How were the Germans aware of this? The book also mentions a bizarre experiment (the author participated in this experiment) that involved the use of extremely powerful magnets (NOT electromagnets). In the experiment, 4 magnets (opposed in pairs forming a "cross") were placed over calibrated rails and slowly moved to the center of the cross. When a certain "critical distance" was reached, a *bluish* glow appeared. After this, a blue fog expanded from the center and one of the experimenters was caught by the fog, suddenly disappearing from sight for an instant. The rest of the experimenters tried to rescue him (the experimenter temporarily lost consciousness) returning the magnets to their original position.

The person involved in this incident suffered no harm, but talked about a fugacious vision of a city with high towers and futuristic buildings with no correspondence to actual cities of our world. The author speculates about a possible intoxication due to ionized air as the cause of the vision but also leaves the door open to other possibilities.
